Question and Answer, May 16, 2023:

Can you please re-confirm that none of the 44 bulk items that come in addition to 3 x 20ft containers is stackable? Also, please advise what type of packing is going to be used for these crates – wood / steel / fiberboard / rigid plastic.

Maybe stackable (2 max), but currently relying on single height floor plan area calc (we anticipate cookie sheet ULD loading at SFO). Majority export approved (ISPM15) timber with skids, but also steel and pelican type instrument containers.

2) We understand that the 20ft containers are not forklift-able. What about the bulk items? Are they forklift-able? If so, will the consignee provide a forklift at the Rubin observatory for offload of bulk items?

Only the Camera Container (CPWU298401-9) is not forkable. All other cargo can be handled by forklift. Therefore, we only require a mobile top lift for the Camera Container. Rubin Observatory will be responsible for off-loading at the summit. All other intermediary transfer points will require contractor engaged handling.

3) Will the cargo contain any dangerous goods (hazardous materials)? I am not referring to data loggers or GPS devices but to any substance or material that has been assigned one of 9 classes of dangerous goods.

We do not anticipate any additional Haz Mat. Our Logistics Manager is qualified in DG Export Declarations.
